Her role is to bring the juniors' voices into ELF and contribute to ELF's work of bringing together patients, the public and respiratory professionals to improve lung health. generate opportunities for the ERS juniors to interact with patients and members of the general public, with the aim of influencing respiratory research and guidelines at the European level.

The Chair of the JMC, Indre Butiene, was invited to attend the meeting "Understanding Lung Health in Europe", held in Brussels, Belgium, at which European Lung White Book and its concise version, Lung Health in Europe Facts and Figures, were officially launched. Discussion during the meeting particularly noted the need for greater public awareness, more focus on education for both patients and professionals and the need for European Union to act in areas where it has the power to bring about changes that will benefit respiratory health. Thus, involvement of all ERS members, especially junior members, is extremely important to spread the information contained in the European Lung White Book and promote wider recognition of the impact lung disease has on the lives of people across Europe. We are delighted that ERS juniors have also contributed to the European Lung White Book.

The ERS is not limited to science within its scientific assemblies, congresses and education. One of the most important goals set by ERS leadership is to create and sustain links with all members of national respiratory societies. The number of national delegates within the ERS has exceeded 70. This

demonstrates that the ERS has become not only a European but also a worldwide organisation. To reflect this, the JMC has elected Georgia Hardavella to try to set up a Junior National Delegates Group with representation from all ERS member countries. We hope that each country will have a Junior National Delegate who will represent junior members in their own country and will be expected to collaborate with the Senior National delegate and the IMC to promote juniors' interests in the ERS and offer them opportunities in the Society. Georgia will be the link between the Junior National Delegates Group, the JMC and the ERS. You are encouraged to contact her if you are interested in being the Junior National Delegate for your country.

We are keen to promote national respiratory events within the ERS member countries that aim to promote junior members work and knowledge. For example the Polish National Delegate organises annual meetings of the Polish ERS group. The purpose of this meeting is to encourage juniors to show data which they are going to send as abstracts for next ERS International Congress. This opportunity aims to increase abstract quality and improve their chances of being accepted for presentation at ERS International Congress.
